

Chemeketa Community College Healthcare Interpreter (HCI) Program Application

Chemeketa's 16-week Healthcare Interpreter Training Program prepares students to work as interpreters in medical settings. The program covers:

- The role of the interpreter
- Standards of practice and the national code of ethics
- Basic anatomy, physiology, and medical terminology
- Cultural competency
- Note-taking and memorization skills

The program includes 90 hours of class instruction, online coursework, and a practicum with Salem Health's Interpreter Team.

Languages offered: Spanish, Russian and Chuukese.

Class Schedule: Saturdays, 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. (4 hours)

Selection Process	Applicants are considered in the order their completed applications are received. Those who meet all requirements and submit all requested documents will be reviewed first.
Immunizations, CPR Requirements & Uniforms	<p>Immunizations: Copies of all required immunization records must be submitted no later than the first day of class. It is recommended that you turn them in to the Behavioral Health and Health Promotion Office before the first day to ensure all requirements are complete.</p> <p>CPR: Copy of CPR Certification – CPR Certification must not expire during time of course. Chemeketa only accepts American Heart Association, “BLS for Healthcare Providers https://atlas.heart.org/</p> <p>Uniforms: Once accepted into the program, you will receive information about uniform requirements and where to purchase them. These details will be included in your “Next Steps” email.</p>
Criminal Background and Drug Screen Instructions on how to complete background check and drug screen will be given to accepted applicants only	<p>Once accepted into the Healthcare Interpreter program, students must pass a drug screen to meet clinical site requirements. Students who do not pass will not be able to continue in the program.</p> <p>Instructions for completing the background check will be included with the acceptance notification. Applicants on a waiting list will receive this information only after being accepted from the list.</p> <p>Background checks will be initiated once the acceptance form is submitted. After receiving the email from Advanced Reporting, students have seven (7) days to complete the background check. Course Registration and Payment	After completing the background check, drug screen, immunizations, application, and required materials, you will receive consent from the Director’s Office to register using the CRN sent to your My Chemeketa email. Payment is made through your Chemeketa account. The cancellation and refund policy, procedures, and class schedule will be reviewed on the first day of class.

Course Attendance Time Commitment	In order to meet the Oregon Health Authority course requirements, students must attend all classes.

English Language Proficiency

- Degree from a U.S. institution of higher education.
- Graduation from a high school or GED in an English-speaking country.
- Graduation from a higher education institution abroad where English is the primary language of instruction.
- Approved English proficiency test results (valid within 4 years): TOEFL 570+/230+/90+, CAE Level 4 (B), CPE Level 5 (B), IELTS 7.0+, ILR 2+, CEFR B2, ACTFL OPI Advanced Mid-Level or above.

Target Language Proficiency

- Degree from an institution where instruction was primarily in the target language (native speaker).
- Graduation from a high school in a country where instruction was primarily in the target language (native speaker).
- Approved test results (valid within 4 years): ILR 2+, CEFR B2, ACTFL OPI Advanced Mid-Level or above.

Language Proficiency Testing (if needed)

Applicants will select their preferred test type and submit payment when turning in their application. Chemeketa will then assign the test, and applicants will have 7–14 days to complete it. If you do not already have approved test results, Chemeketa will assign a listening and speaking test through ALTA Language Services.
